A dentist is someone who cares for your mouth, including your teeth, and makes sure that they are kept healthy.

They will ask you to sit in a big chair.

Above the chair there is a big bright light so that the dentist can see inside your mouth.

The dentist might ask you to wear a pair of glasses to protect your eyes.



When you sit on the chair, the chair will slowly go backwards.

The dentist will ask you to open your mouth wide so that they can count and look at your teeth.



The dentist might put a little mirror inside your mouth so that they can see your teeth really well.



The dentist may also use a probe to check the health of your teeth and gums.



Your check has finished.

Your dentist will help you to sit up on their special chair.
